**The 2nd Annual Sharing Patients Conference:
Integrating Mental Health Treatment into the Primary Care Setting**

This conference is designed to provide participants with evidence-based approaches to incorporating mental health treatment into the primary care setting. Studies have found that up to 30% of primary care patients have a psychiatric disorder but up to half go unrecognized. The National Comorbidity Replication Study found that only 13% of individuals with mental illnesses who were seen by general medical practitioners received adequate care. The learning objectives of this conference are to improve the health and functioning of patients through early identification of mental disorders; improve the response to mental health treatment through increased collaboration with specialty mental health providers; and ensure adequate treatment for mental illnesses.

Audience: This conference is intended for physicians, nurses, medical or nursing directors, quality assurance staff of health care plans, and other primary care providers.
